The National Teacher of the Year candidate has the respect and admiration of their colleagues and:

Is an expert in their field who advances growth for students of all backgrounds and abilities; builds collaboratives relationships with colleagues, students, and families to create a school culture of equity and success; deliberately connects the classroom to community to impact student growth and learning; as a lifelong learner and teacher leader, they utilize innovation to create learning experiences within and beyond the classroom; and expresses themselves in an engaging and clear way, conveying the lived classroom experience to a variety of audiences.

Response Question 1

Describe a content lesson or unit that defines you as a teacher. How did you engage students of all backgrounds and abilities in the learning? Show how your deliberate instructional decisions create student learning and reveal your beliefs about teaching and learning. *(maximum 750 words)*

Describe a project or initiative you have been involved in that deliberately creates culture in your classroom or school. Describe how you build and use relationships to collaborate and to teach students of all backgrounds, abilities, and identities. What is the status of the project today?
